Festival Youth Instruction—Thursday, Oct. 5 and Saturday, Oct. 7, 1-1:45 p.m. in the Delaware Room (grades K-2) and Lehigh Room (grades 3-5). Parents, please drop off your children 15 minutes early and pick them up immediately after the class before church services.

Teen Bible Study—Thursday, Oct. 5, 1-2 p.m. in the Susquehanna Room (prior to the 2 p.m. holy day service). Those aged 12-18 (or in high school) are invited to open the Feast with a Bible study.

Young Adult Bible Study/Seminar—Thursday, Oct. 5, 1-2 p.m. in the VIP Room (prior to the 2 p.m. holy day service). All young adults (high school grads through 30s) are invited. Don't miss this opportunity for early festival interaction with other young adults.

Family Dance—Saturday night, Oct. 7, 7-10 p.m. in the main meeting hall. All are welcome to join us for an enjoyable evening of music, dancing and fellowship.

New York City Tour—Sunday, Oct. 8: A luxury coach bus will depart from the rear parking lots. Snack bags will be distributed as you board the bus. Upon arrival, we'll enjoy a variety of meal options at the [Hudson Eats Food Court](#) (Brookfield Place). Each person will purchase his own meal, according to his preference. Before the bus tour, each person will have the option to walk across the street for a personal tour of the World Trade Center outdoor sites (Freedom Tower, Oculus, 9/11 Memorial).

Next, between 5 and 6 p.m., everyone will reboard our coach buses (not double-decker buses). We'll be joined by a tour guide, who will narrate information about a variety of exciting sights (brief stops for pictures along the way). Here are a few potential sights during the [Downtown Tour](#): Times Square, Empire State Building, Wall Street, Greenwich Village, Chinatown/Little Italy, Brooklyn Bridge, Battery Park (view of Statue of Liberty), United Nations, Rockefeller Center and more.

Please consider the mobility needed to get on and off buses and walking perhaps several blocks.
