

## **Park City, Utah 2023 Feast Activities**

Park City offers a number of activities for all age groups. Families with children can enjoy the Swaner Preserve and EcoCenter that is open year-round, activities vary throughout the year. Park City Escape Room can also be a highlight, they have four different rooms to choose from for all age groups 9+. At Kimball Art Center, kids and adults can experience a number of art activities. If you love the outdoors, rent a bike and cruise one of Park City's paved paths or the Historic Pacific Union Rail Trail or take a beautiful fall horseback ride through nature or just take a hike up one of the many hiking trails in the area.

Visit Utah Olympic Park and experience a few of the activities, one of which is the Alf Engen Museum that reflects the 2002 Winter Olympics. You can practice your swing on the many golf courses in the area or take a tour of the Whiskey Distillery before enjoying an educational tasting. Park City also has an Ice Arena that offers free-skate hours if you want to spend some time racing around the rink. For the adults who want to express their creativity, the Paint Mixer is an excellent place to go with a group of your friends and spend a relaxing evening painting and enjoying snacks and drinks.

Not too far away in Salt Lake City there are a number of activities as well. There you can visit the Mormon Square, which is quite interesting and educational. Utah's Hogle Zoo is a beautiful place to visit, or if it gets a little cool outside, take the kids to the Discovery Gateway Children's Museum or Loveland Living Planet Aquarium.

### **Location of services:**

The Prospector, 2175 Sidewinder Drive, Park City, UT 84060. Parking is in several lots around the theatre. There is also parking available on the street. For those who are handicapped, go to the left of The Prospector entrance and look for a parking attendant to direct you into a spot just outside the meeting hall. The opening night service is at 7:30 p.m. on Friday, Sept. 29, in the Grand Celebrity Theatre.

**Family Day—Wednesday, Oct. 4, 2-4 p.m.:**

What could be more fun than enjoying a ride through the Wasatch Mountains of Utah? This approximately 120-minute trip offers incredible views of the Wasatch Mountains, the wide-open vistas of Deer Creek Reservoir and the beautiful Heber Valley. The Deer Creek Express departs from the depot, follows the shores of Deer Creek Reservoir to Decker Bay (about seven track miles), and returns.

A box lunch can be purchased in advance and snacks are available for purchase in the depot prior to boarding and on board the train.

**Please arrive no later than 1:30 p.m.** The train will not wait for latecomers as they are on a tight schedule. Gourmet box lunches include a choice of turkey, roast beef or vegetarian sandwich, freshly baked cookie, chips and bottled water or soft drink for \$15 each. Lunch will be handed out on board for you to eat on your lap in the passenger car during the ride.

Note: This is about a 30-minute drive from The Prospector. We are not allowed to bring outside food or beverages onto the train. Infant car seats and strollers are not allowed on the train for safety reasons. Wheelchair access is very limited.
