Tuesday, Sept. 25, 2 p.m.—Como Park Zoo and Conservatory

Enjoy exotic plants and beautiful displays in various gardens, as well as animal exhibits, including sea lions, polar bears, gorillas and giraffes. Wednesday, Sept. 26, 2 p.m.—Stillwater Trolley Tour

Your old-time trolley ride will let you see beautiful views of the St. Croix River Valley, lumber baron mansions in the hills of Stillwater and historic lift bridge constructed in 1931. You'll also learn about history and folklore of Stillwater. This historic tour is \$13.50 for adults aged 18 and up, and is \$12.50 for seniors aged 62 and up.
